


THE LESSONS FOR USE ON THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST ~ YEAR B Psalm 130 • Lamentations 3:21-33 Current Series: 1st Corinthians

WE AFFIRM THE FOLLOWING:

- The Holy Trinity of God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- God has revealed Himself fully and decisively in Holy Scripture. We believe the Bible, consisting of the Old and New Testaments, to be the inspired, infallible, and authoritative Word of God and our guide for faith and life.
- There is only one way to Salvation through Jesus Christ.
- The sanctity of human life based on our creation in the image of God and our election by God for service in His Kingdom. This leads us to respectfully affirm the sanctity of life at every stage, from conception to ordinary death.
- The Biblical principles of immutable gender and sexuality: The exclusive union of one man and one woman in marriage; and fidelity to its vows. And, chastity outside of marriage for the sake of the Kingdom.
- God made all people from one man and although people can be distinguished by different ethnicities and nationalities, we are all one human race and absolute equals before God in creation, the need for repentance, and the offer of redemption.
- That the mission of the Church is to spread the Good News of the Gospel in every word and deed. Proclaiming to the world the atoning death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and seeking to bring every person into a life of faith, discipleship, and submission to Him.

July 4th is a day of profound significance in our history. It marks the momentous occasion in 1776 when our nation, once a colony of England, boldly declared itself an independent nation. On that date, our founding fathers affixed their signatures to the document that would go down in history as the Declaration of Independence, a testament to our unwavering determination to forge our own path as a free country.

Our independence did not come easily; only after several difficult years of war would it finally be won. Nor were our first years as a nation free from problems and controversies (as is still true). But our forefathers were determined to establish a free republic with a democratic system of government, and the Declaration of Independence (together with our Constitution and the Bill of Rights) became the foundation for this. They have stood the test of time, and on July 4th, we give thanks for the wisdom, faith, and courage of those leaders. Out of the 55 men at the Constitutional Convention, 50 of them were orthodox Christians. In one survey of the political literature of the founding era, it was determined that the apostle Paul was quoted at the same level as were Montesquieu and Blackstone, and Deuteronomy was quoted twice as much as John Locke. Unlike the French Revolution, which erased the Christian calendar in order to install their own humanist version, the U.S. Constitution was drafted it says: "in the year of our Lord, 1789." The Declaration acknowledged our rights are inalienable precisely because they were bestowed on us "by our Creator." Inscribed on the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia (which proclaimed our independence) are these words from Scripture: "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof' (Leviticus 25:10, KJV). Our history is intertwined with faith, and it is this faith that has guided us through the years, instilling in us a deep sense of gratitude and reverence.

Although it is not a religious holiday like Christmas or Easter, July 4th can be a time to reflect on God's goodness to us as a nation. As we reflect with gratitude on this July 4th, let us also look forward with faith and commit our future and our lives to God and His will. The timeless words of the Psalmist still ring true: "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord" (Psalm 33:12).




